

The General Syndicate of Scientific Professions was established in the mid-fifties after desperate attempts that failed, especially for the small number of graduates of the Faculty of Science at the time. Events continued until the Syndicate's branch was established in Alexandria in the mid-sixties as the largest branch at the level of 22 branches across the republic aimed at serving the graduates of the Faculty of Science - Alexandria University.
