

## The second group in the MOOC “Gender in Digital Education”

Alexandria University is a key partner of the University Agency of Francophonie in the Alliance of Universities for **Gender Equality**

Within the framework of achieving the SDG5, and two years after the formation of the Alliance of Universities for Gender Equality, which includes eleven international Francophone universities, including the **University of Alexandria**, the University Agency for Francophonie (AUF) issued the final booklet summarizing the achievements of the Alliance.



Prof. Ghada Abdel Wahab Al-Khayyat, Head of the Department of Information Systems and Computers at the Faculty of Business and Executive Director of the Center for Educational Innovations and Distance Learning at the University, indicated that she participated in a workshop in Paris, representing Alexandria University, to discuss the work of the Francophone Alliance for Gender Equality in Universities, explaining that she had adopted Work on the project by developing the fourth axis of the axes adopted by the coalition, which is the axis of “Equality-Based Education.”: “Gender egalitarian Pedagogy”, to which the university’s educational innovations system contributed.

She added that the period of work with the coalition was an opportunity to present the achievements of the Egyptian state with regard to work on the issue of **women and gender equality**, and to present the efforts of Alexandria University in this field and what is being accomplished through the **Unit for Combating Violence against Women**, as these efforts were referred to in the published booklet, She pointed out the continuity of Alexandria University’s contribution through accepting a new group of trainees on the MOOC, on April 4, 2023, which was the result of the Open2Sustain project, in which a number of international Francophone universities participated, including Alexandria University.
