

- 1. Construction of corridors in all campus to facilitate their movement with wheelchair.
- 2. Provision of special priority elevators are available for any student with special needs.
- 3. Availability of wheel chairs in the Faculties for emergency and special cases.
- 4. A special place in the campus as clinics for the conscription site to physically examine the students with special needs and give them certificates of exemptionfrom conscription, as a contribution from college to reduce burden on them and their families.
- 5. Replacing steps with ramps for disabled people Alexandria University.
- 6. Accessible toilet for disabled people.
- 7. Special exam settings for students with visual impairments
- 8. Availability of shadow volutes to read for blind students
- 9. Special care centres for mental and health care.
